

# editors vibes

There is some heavy reaction to recent statements made by Jesus People about the institutional Church scene of late. For all those who really want to know the truth as to what Jesus People feel (—OUCH—, did that hurt somebody?) lets set the record straight. First. I wish people would listen to ALL we say, not simply one sentence in three.

Quote— "Unless the local church is renewed and built up I give the Jesus Movement 2 years to fold under its own weight. And it will. Then leave a tragic trail of disillusioned kids without roots and without spiritual homes."

In the U.S. it is stated in one news release: "For a variety of complex reasons the Jesus People are edging back to the Church of their parents." So says Ray Ruppert religion editor for the Seattle Times: "The Institutional church is being rediscovered as a living and hopeful community by many of those who were ready a short time ago to abandon it as rigid and obsolete."

One factor he states was the drop-out rate of some street Christians. But I think his second reason bears heavy emphasis in Australia . . . "the willingness of Church laity and clergy to accept them."

You see the Church is changing and for those Jesus Freaks who have thrown aside their staid and often tradition bound "heavy" brothers and sisters we say "Have some patience and love towards all the family."

However, as John Hirt put it: "We believe the true traitors of the Church are those who would rather stay in the ruts of a dead tradition than follow in the steps of a living Christ." We believe that! The true compassionate pastor will always receive our warmest support in his ministry. But if men hide their unChristlike isolationism and disobedience to the great commission behind 'out-of-context' scripture quotes such as "Come out from among them and be ye separate — etc" Well — what else can we do but challenge them.

The slack Christian or church has every good reason to fear the Jesus People, for the Pharisees and the true disciples of Jesus will always be at odds.

The question is not — "Has he criticized the Church?" The real questions are — Has he criticized it out of concern? Has he abandoned it? Is the criticism valid?

What are the loving criticisms we as adult members make? First — the great commission has been reversed: Jesus did not say, "Come all sinners into our church building to hear the Gospel." He said

"Go my disciples..." into all the world. Incidently, we probably do as much evangelism IN the Church as almost any comparable organization, but the people — 90 per cent of them, are NOT THERE. They are in the Pool room, at the road races, on the streets, in their homes!! And that's where Jesus' disciples ought to be.

Secondly — The Church was made for the people — not the people for the Church. How may I ever bare my heart, ask my question, share my dilemma in the heavy structured worship of today? We must open the system and turn Church into a two-way communication. It must be a feeling family relationship.

Thirdly — Me thinks some have lost sight of the fact that Jesus is the only product we have worth selling (pardon the gross analogy!) Unless we become Jesus People before Methodists, Pentecostals, Baptists, evangelicals, neo-orthodox etc. we are lost.

Fourth — Hey Man! Did the Holy Spirit get lost in the Book of Acts? I don't hear much about experimental knowledge of Him. Oh yes, a few bitter skirmishes over the theology of it all. The Spirit isn't a theology brother, He's a person and without Him and His gifts 'we ain't gonna make it.'

How can an editor evade the counter thrust of the erstwhile critic with so little space allotted to him?

When recently asked by Matric. students why youth (that is 95 per cent!!) do not attend Church, I replied:

replied:

1. In some cases the Church isn't worth going to. (If yours is, you don't need to flinch).

2. In many cases because he speaks English and the Church speaks Chinese — Well, almost that bad. Truth is always communicated by words. If my words are not in the language of the people, they will not hear my message. (Try some disjointed tape recordings of Sunday morning worship music mixed with modern folk, rock, etc.) Oh my brothers you know what you are saying, but they do not.

3. And of course in many cases — Its a great Church, real people, real love, real fellowship, real communication . . . but the kid won't go because he is scared that Jesus will expose his emptiness. It isn't all the Church's fault because — Jesus said "Men-love darkness rather than light because their deeds are evil". So, if your Church really Knows Jesus and is more concerned with living his life-style of undying love, than with mere traditions of the past, you ought not to be embarrassed by some loving analysis.

## CHANGE: THE FUTURE SHOCK!

### Treatment? Jesus therapy.

One of the most important characteristics of the contemporary world which distinguishes it from times past is the ever increasing rate and extent of change. If one could represent the situation on a graph, it might show a curve gently rising through about 95 per cent of recorded history, then rising markedly in the past century, and finally soaring off the paper at a near-vertical angle in the last generation.

The current best-seller by Alvin Toffler, FUTURE SHOCK, diagnoses the damaging effects of rapid change on individuals and societies unable to accommodate it. He then proceeds to suggest ways of coping with this situation in order to prevent psychological, social and environmental collapse. Although much of his book is devoted to strategies for coping with change on an institutional level, Toffler and other writers on "modernization' problems have tended to view the central problem as a personal one: men need to be changed. There are several ways in which a person finds

himself unable to cope with new social situations. He attaches himself to a particular lifestyle or group and resists any idea of abandoning it. This goes not only for the middle-class materialist, but also for the social critic who calls for change but refuses to entertain the possibility that his methods of dealing with it might be either obsolete or not as effective as alternative ones. Another reaction to the problems caused by change is simply copping out; hang loose and do your own thing.

A further problem is extreme disorientation by the extent of change and the choices available; not knowing which end is up and being unable to act often when wanting to.

Certainly part of the solution is informational. If we could anticipate change better and map out possible alternative responses to it, we would be less "shocked." But Toffler seems to realize that at its root the problem is a moral one. We must anticipate and direct change because it is RIGHT, since (assuming Toffler's diagnosis of future shock is correct) uncontrolled rapid change is harmful to human beings. It is also moral because each individual must be willing and able to change his own attitudes and behavior.

In order to solve the moral problem, Toffler and others call for a new consciousness in the individual; indeed, a new man. This new man ideally would desire to know what kind of change would be least harmful and most just to men, and be willing to support and participate in such change.

... just as the acceleration of change and increased novelty in the environment demand a new form of organisation, they demand, too, a new kind

Toffler's new man is to be entirely self-created; like most other secular humanists, he finds his answer in "education." Part and parcel of this man-centered view is that there are no moral absolutes; man must create his own values in response to changing personal and social needs. This "ought" is solely determined by the calculations and prognoses of social scientists. Presumably, when he is educated to what changes are most warranted by society's need to survive, new secular man will realise that stubborn attachment to the status quo or copping out is not in his self-interest. Furthermore, when the society is oriented toward change as the most important fact of life, the new man supposedly neither is overwhelmed by the pace of change nor

Fundamentally, however, the malady of "future shock" goes deeper than just the condition of being overwhelmed by the pace and extent of change because of lack of experience or information. New secular man is also supposed to escape psychological collapse by becoming (through education) secure in his understanding of his place in the world. But the rapid change gives new urgency to the more basic human hang-up of wondering what is the purpose of all this change, of life itself. Toffler has no answer to this problem.

There are two probable reasons why Toffler might be concerned about the harm of future shock to human beings. One is the rather cold, biologically deterministic idea that we as men must work for the "preservation of the species;" we do it because we must. The alternative to this is the moralistic view that human beings are wonderful and we must seek to minimise harm to them.

But from his secular humanist frame of reference, Toffler cannot say WHY human beings are wonderful. Existence has no purpose; it just IS. Toffler presents no remedy for this more basic "shock;" his new man has no way to alleviate the meaninglessness we experience in living this life of

The New Testament also speaks about a new man. Jesus told Nicodemus that he had to be born again (John 3:3) Paul was talking about this new birth when he wrote, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation" (2 Cor. 5:17) Being a new man in Christ demands an attitude which is READY FOR CHANGE in obedience to the moral standards of God: "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2) The new man in Christ is prepared for change because 1, he knows that the significance of

individual and collective life is not lost in a purposeless cycle of existence but that it is moving somewhere in accordance with the plan of an objectively-existing, personal God, and 2, he knows that the present state of the world is full of imperfections (which the Bible calls sin, rooted in man's willful defiance of God) and that therefore change is imperative.

The moral commitment of new secular man is not only limited by the lack of a sense of ultimate purpose, but also by the necessity of depending upon a self-made moral code and faith in the power of education. The new man in Christ, on the other hand, is able to evaluate the moral choices posed by the demands of a rapidly changing society on the basis of moral imperatives revealed by the Lord of the universe (James 1:5). Since his commitment is to the will of God and not to his own self-interest or to the interest of any group of men, he is constantly ready to regard his own social and political commitments, and all systems of men, as open to question, and to change his allegiances when

This commitment also does not allow the Christian to be a cop-out; the love of God fleshed out in Christ's life demands that the Christian support whatever social or political arrangement most conforms to God's standards of love, healing and justice. Finally, new Christian man differs from "new" secular man in that in admitting the inability to change himself and in letting God do it, he receives the power of transformation from an external source: the Holy Spirit.

Toffler and his colleagues do have some good practical suggestions for strategies of institutional adaptation to change, but there is little promise for the solution of the most basic problems on the level of the individual. While secular man is scurrying about on a social treadmill, the new creature in Christ is being truly transformed (Phil. 1:6). Not only is he being made more and more capable of facing is he being made more and more capable of facing up to change, he is also being prepared for the most mind-blowing change of all: the end of time, and the creation of a new heaven and a new earth (Rev. 21:1-

### new?morality

Stephenson, I would like to thank you for the opportunity to debate with you. I enjoyed it, so I hope you did. I thought you might like me to clarify my ideas about the permissive society, so that you can better understand WHAT IS THE PERMISSIVE SOCIETY?

A hundred years ago everybody accepted that right and wrong were clear-cut, black and white opposites. Almost without exception, the whole human race believed in absolutes. Everything was absolute—absolute moral standards, absolute truth, absolute good, absolute authority, absolute right and wrong.

This period was one in which people's thinking could be categorized as thesis-antithesis. If one thing was right, its opposite was wrong. If peace is good, then war is bad. This type of thinking didn't allow for something to be right for you and wrong for me. Either it was right or it was wrong. It couldn't be both.

During the twentieth century, this style of thinking has gradually changed. The absolutes which we clung to grimly last century have become blurred. Man has tossed out the concept of absolutes. Our thinking could now be called "thesis antithesis-synthesis". This implies that what is right for me isn't necessarily right for you

The last decade has seen the emergence of situation ethics. Under this system, you can do what you like, so long as it is OK in your own eyes. Some people add the proviso that it is only OK if it doesn't harm anyone else. But then if you are the judge of your own behaviour, you probably also feel like judging that it doesn't hurt anyone.

The permissive society is one in which the traditional moral values, and the social sanctions for enforcing those values, are openly being abandoned. These changes in moral values are coming about under the humanistic philosophy of the self-regulating man. Humanism is a philosophy which postulates that man can start from himself and find all the answers. Hence only self-imposed moral sanctions are valid, according to humanism. However, a look at the world today is enough to throw serious doubt on the proposition that man can solve all his problems himself.

Situation ethics is the basis for the permissive society. The situation is the deciding factor in all moral behaviour. The permissive society, under the influence of situation ethics and humanism, recognizes no absolute standards of moral behaviour. Now if you push this permissivemess to its logical conclusion, nothing has any meaning. What I do depends on how I view the world myself. Any I can view it however I like. It need have no relation at all to reality.

It is at the point of its relationship with reality that I would question the permissive society. It seems to avoid reality. The reality is that man is not capable of directing his own affairs. He has made an ugly mess of God's world. The reality is that we live in a society and everything we do affects the society. The reality is that I cannot "decide" that my actions are right, and thus make them right. If this were so, I could decide that it is right for me to assasinate the Queen. But this would not make it right. The reality is that right is right and wrong is wrong, irrespective of what I may call them, (I am not saying that I will decide what is right, instead of you. I am saying that no-one is capable of drawing up his own code of behaviour. Because right and wrong are independent of people).

The reality is that truth really is absolute. If something is true for you but not for me, then the concept of truth is

meaningless.

Whereas the permissive society avoids reality, the Christian system faces reality. It values all people, not just the individual himself. It deals with the universe as it really is, and it deals with man as he really is. The Christian system doesn't hide from the absolutes that are real. Instead it is based totally on the person from whom those


Right and Left, good and bad, violent and peaceful, we all seem anxious to co-opt this Jesus and use him for our own idealistic ends; forgetting that he did not allow us that kind of option. Those who tried to use him were repulsed. He demanded FOLLOWERS. His role was not that of a powerful Socratic gadfly come to sting an impervious Rome; it was to seek and to save men who were lost. He did not speak as an avatar within the panthesite tradition but spoke as Messiah from within the deep rooted monotheistic tradition of Judaism. Astrologers worshipped at his cradle, demons were afraid of him, and even the natural forces of the cosmos yielded to his command. He pointed back to an Alpha before time and forward to an Omega when time would end. He even said "I am Alpha and Omega." This is a Jesus of cosmic dimensions. Before we drag him down to finite proportions and divest him of his majesty let us look at his claims, his place in history and the destiny he fulfilled. Most of us think we know the Old and New Testaments but often our "knowing" is second hand like our knowledge of the Koran or Das Kapital. Our sources are rarely primary. The weekly popularizers and myth makers with their instant wisdom are far more tempting

Bikes,

Everyone knows it's windy! In winter-time, it's cold: very cold. It's easy for a bike to become the sole thing in a guy's life — or a chick's. They look good — they give status and recognition in the eyes of envious onlookers. They feel tremendous, out on the road, eating the miles up.

But bikes clog. You bust a chain, blow the head off a valve, buckle your wheels in a pot-hole, and suddenly: the beautiful machine is a heap of junk: sometimes only good for the memories. Any person who relys on a bike for "the permanent trip" in life soon gets sick of the things and people in the scene he or she is in — and wants to split. If the bike gets dropped too badly, there's nothing much left to keep you going: Like the old folds say: "nothing to live for".

When a human being will open up to Jesus (and I am telling you: he is still around because he is God and is eternal) the bike moves well down the line in the things that seem important. Man, nothing can thrill like Jesus when he really touches one of the children in his family. "Nortons or Kwakas" or anything else just aren't in it.



Why do it? Because every person who is a club member knows what it is like to genuinely give the whole self to Jesus (he's alive! remember). When a person has such peace and starts to get blessed in so many ways he never thought could happen, the person usually wants to help other people around him into God's family. Jesus has shown to us that the clothes a fella or chick wears mean nothing: neither does their social background or their individual life style. All people need Jesus — Bike guys, surfies, hippies, High and Tech kids, parents — old fols: everyone's a person underneath. And it's no good if God's people keep to themselves in church each Sunday if Jesus' message is what he has told us it is — if it's for all — the guys in the pubs and pool rooms as well as the ones in seats in church. And you know, even if you shout, when you're shouting inside a church, you can't be heard much outside. If you don't believe me, try it!!

God Squad is non-establishment, not anti establishment! We love Christians in church just as much as we love the people in the drive-in down the road. Christians are God's children and many people in church are far closer to God and live far better for Him than I do! that's dinkum.

No-one has the right to knock a group of God's people. But sometimes the life-style of a group is not as open to the freedom and joy, kindness, tolerance and love as it might be. If Jesus can use his servants — on bikes — to help others come to Him in Church and out of Church, then we must be open to anything he'd like us to do.

What about the other guys, in the outlaw bike clubs? Well. Like it says: everyone's human underneath. Its always open — you can drop in whenever you feel like it. We go on runs quite often. Sometimes we get invited by a church — (we went to Kaniva a few weeks ago by invitation) or go to a coffee shop or the streets at night — sleeping in a hall, people inviting us in for breakfast. We meet guys and chicks with a lot of different hangups, and some wonderful Jesus people. Jesus gives us a grouse time) — sometimes we go just where it seems a good place to go — to talk to people and to share thoughts, problems, ideas and experiences closely with each other. ### meet Chris....

Chris has left a life of boozing, fuzz-hassling to work full time at the Jesus House

Here he tells his story



I have been asked to give a testimony of some of my past. I don't know who reads this, but I just hope that my testimony will be worthwhile to someone.

I left school at the age of fourteen, and ever since I left school, I have been roaming Australia trying to search for something that would satisfy me. I always seemed to be in and out of jail, always seemed to be doing something wrong, and I never seemed to be able to live my life without doing something stupid. Maybe this is because I had to force myself to be someone that I wasn't because of the way society was — unless you are a certain sort of person, you aren't really accepted.

I spent a lot of my life in the Northern Territory and the northern parts of Australia. I think my life really started to go down when I had an accident on a motor-bike when I was only sixteen. I smashed into a car at about seventy miles an hour, and I nearly killed myself. I thought then I might just as well have been dead.

I've got many convictions and a pretty big record from some of the things that I foolishly did as a young bloke. I was the sort of person that was hurt very easily, and I had a great love for my friends. I was let down so many times, that I just couldn't be bothered being a good friend to anybody anymore. I just didn't want to have any contact with any people. I just wanted to be on my own. At times I just wished that I had no-one that was really close who knew me. I sometimes wished that my parents would vanish into thin air, and all my relations, and anybody that ever knew me would just leave me alone. And I suppose because this wasn't possible and I couldn't seem to run away from these things I fought within myself because I couldn't get it together.

All through these years I tried so hard to prove myself. I didn't want to have to answer to anyone. If I was away I never used to write unless I had to. I just wanted to escape. I never seemed to miss



anybody, and I found it very hard to love anybody after a while because I'd been let down so many times by people that I thought so much of. But anyway, I got married, and I thought, now that I'm married this'll be an excuse to say no to my friends when they want me to go down to the pub; and to say no to this and that. I thought I'd use my wife as an excuse and that this would be an excuse to start a new life for myself, but what I didn't realise was that it wasn't my mates and my friends that were to blame, but it was me. My friends would come and ask me to go out, and I'd go out. I'd get rotten drunk and I'd come home and treat my wife bad. I just couldn't get over this kind of life. I ended up starting to run again, with my wife this time, and ended up going to the Northern Territory. I thought, well, this'll be good because it'll give me the chance to start again. I never learnt the lesson.

and no matter where I went I was never happy. But I thought with my wife I would be happy, so I tried it again, and I went up to Alice Springs, and the story was the same there, and I ended up in trouble again. I was thrown into jail up in Alice Springs for fighting in the street, and even though it wasn't much and didn't cost me much, it was the best thing that ever happened to me. The policeman that picked me up was a Christian cop, and he was really nice to me. He wasn't like the rest of the police that I'd dealt with before this time, because most of the police that I have dealt with have been very plastic and unreal. But this policeman was very forgiving, and just told me that he was doing his job, and told me that he was a Christian. It was good to see someone who cared. He really helped me a great deal but it didn't do any good because I was still running from people. I went back down to Victoria to try again, and I met up with my old mates. Things were still the same. I just couldn't seen to win and I knew that I had to do something with my life soon or I'd just have to finish it, because it was really bad. Anyway, I ended up becoming a Christian, trying to make my life worthwhile. I really wanted to be a Christian. I read the Bible so much that I think I studied more than most people study. After a while the devil just got to me, and got me right down again. and I just went right down, and I went back into the bike scene again.

I-hung round with a few guys in a club in Morwell, and got around with them for a while; things just didn't seem to be right. I just couldn't seem to get it together. Anyway, I ended up meeting one of the God's Squad up in Melbourne and I came along with them to a meeting that night, and I gave a testimony that night saying that I would try, and come back to the Lord, even though I wasn't a very good Christian.

Anyway, I went back, back to my home town and got back with the old club again, and went down again, this time worse than ever. I was really getting stoned out of my mind and my wife and I were fighting all the time, and we just couldn't seem to make ends meet. It ended up that I got on to another girl. And I started going down to see her. My life was just a complete mess. I just couldn't get it together. I heard the Squad was coming down, and I suppose I was a bit rebellious and everything that seemed to happen seemed to be against me and I just couldn't seem to work it out. I thought that God was to blame and when I heard that the Squad was coming down, we got the club together and we waited for them and went up to the Church where they were going, and I broke up their whole meeting and really made a mess of things. I was just so stoned out of my mind that I just didn't care what I did. I knocked God, and everything else. I knocked John Smith and really made a mess of things that night. The day after, the God's Squad asked me to come to a camp with them, and I went there but never took much notice. Later I decided that I'd go up to Melbourne with these guys, and if it was any good and I could get it together, I'd get my wife to come up after.

Anyway, I went up to Melbourne, and I was just as bad up here, mucking around and drinking all the time, coming home to the Centre stoned out of my mind some nights. Me and my wife broke up all together. I just started to wonder whether I could make it, and thinking that I was the only one in the world who was so weak. I thought I must have been the weakest person in the world.

I ended up going on a trip with the God's Squad to Perth, and while I was on this trip with these guys I saw a lot of things that I wished I could have in my life, and I gave Jesus a go.

Since then, I've had a lot of hassles, and a lot of things have happened that have got me down, but I believe that all these things have had a purpose. Jesus has really changed my life, I know that much, because this time I really meant it. Sometimes I wonder if Jesus is real or not, and I hassle it out in my mind and I see things that are just so amazing to me that I say to myself, well, how can he not be real?

So many things that have happened since I've become a Christian that are just absolute miracles, that I just can't deny that Christ is alive. He's really given me a new love for people. I've gone out witnessing for Him, and this has given me a new love for people on the street level. At the moment, I'm looking after the house here at the Centre, and I have my own little flock under me. Kids that are trying themselves and I can understand them, because I've only just come out of the scene myself, and I haven't really forgotten any of the horrible feelings that I had while I was in that scene. I really love them and feel for them deeply.

Now my wife and I are really happy and we're back together. I've never been so happy in my life as far as a marriage is concerned. Jesus has just brought my marriage together. He's put the pieces in my life together. It's just been really beautiful.

I'd just like to say to any kid who feels the same way as I felt, and who just can't seem to get it together. I feel for you brother, and I just wish you could come and talk with me. If there is anyone around Melbourne or even further away than that, that is so hassled in his brain that he just can't seem to get it together, and you're running all the time, and don't know what you're running for, come and see me, and we'll try and work out something together.



# KAIROS—SUCCES

# OR

### Two thousand march.

About sixty Bikie Jesus People joined two thousand others for a weekend invasion of Canberra recently. The aim of the weekend was to expose the plastic nature of our world system to the politicians and to the people of Canberra, and to our nation as a whole, and to present Jesus Christ, His life and His teachings, as the only real solution to the transformation of human nature and, thereby, of the whole of society.

In many respects it was an outstanding success, in that it brought together brothers and sisters from an incredibly wide range of background and experience: buys from right within the Church scene; kids who'd been in Christian communes and had found the Lord in the midst of drug situations. However, some of us feel and want to put down in print, something of the challenge of the after thought of Kairos.


We know in our hearts where we are, and although Jesus means a tremendous amount to us, He has changed our lives in such a way that there is simply no easy explanation for it apart from what Jesus explained Himself about His own power. In spite of all this, the Jesus People need to think very carefully through the slogans which we shout; through the posters which we carry and the buttons which we wear on our clothes.

Kairos was a great challenge to many of us to think more deeply about the alternatives which we have to the plastic life styles of people in our society. We not only need to be able to say to them that they can find Jesus and begin a change within their lives, but we need to fill in some details of what a real Christian life style is in the midst of a technological day: in the midst of many philosophies of freedom and sometimes despair.

It was the beginning, many of us believe, of a show of strength of a growing Jesus Movement within our country. Some reporters, particularly in religious press have recently stated that the Jesus Movement is winding down. On the contrary, those of us who are in the midst of it are impressed by the daily growth, and we are quite convinced that though it might change its form in days to come, some may be turned into hard core Jesus revolutionaries right in the midst of the system — on the street, and in communes. Some may be turned back to the more normal institution of the Church to bring new life and renewal there. But we are convinced the Jesus Movement had only just begun and the show of selected strength of two thousand at Canberra is only one indication that God is on the move in our country.

Some of the accommodation was certainly not first class. Many of the kids in their desire to share Jesus were willing to sleep in a number of sheep pens at Queanbeyan. Certainly the kids must have felt pretty strongly about their relationship towards Jesus Christ. They must have felt strongly about their desire to communicate love to our country. You had to be keen to sleep in these open sheep pens (with a little bit of fresh hay). Of course, there were those who slept on concrete steps!

Saturday morning the Canberra traffic was slowed down, and even stopped at times briefly, while the Jesus People marched two miles through the city streets.

During this period on the lawn, a manifest to the nation was read and presented to the parliamentarians of our country. So we are here to make it known that we share the concern of this and every government for a better quality of life, both for the voting majority and for the oppressed minority; but we know from our own lives that no amount of legislation will liberate man from those basic desires that make legislation necessary, such as hate, lies, greed, apathy and lust for power. Legislating for the symptoms of the ills of our society should be preceded by treating the root cause of those ills. Therefore, we declare to you our conviction that the only workable life-style for mankind, the only way of dealing with the root cause of society's problems, is personal submission to the authority of God through the person and work of Jesus Christ. We know that God's love has brought a revolution in our own lives and we want to express that love to you, the Parliamentarians and to all whom you govern, that in your life and in the lives of thousands of Australians there will be a revolution for Jesus.

Let's face it. The world system is crumbling! Society's double values no longer make any sense. And yet we go on believing everything's O.K.


we need a change

# JESUS CECERATION RAP: as spruked at Kairos by Smithy.

Possibly there are some of you nere wno were around the University complaining that all we could talk about was praising Jesus. Then brother, I am sorry about that, but we are at it again. It is all we have got to say. In Luke 4, it talks about Him going to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. He went to the synagogue as was His usual custom and he stood up to read. There was given to Him the book of the prophet Isaiah, the same beautiful prophet we just had read to us. And he opened the book and He found the place where it was written,

"The spirit of the Lord is upon me because He has annointed me to preach good news to the poor. He sent me to proclaim release to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord." He closed the book and He gave it back to the attendant and He sat down and all the eyes of the synagogue were fixed upon him.

So we are not the first lot of people to be "grabbed"

by Jesus.

'Everybody sitting in the place, whether pro or con, found themselves with their eyes fixed on Him as He spoke to them. And He began to say to them, "Today this scripture is being fulfilled in your hearing".

Brothers and Sisters, this is a Jesus celebration and I just want to say to any of you who don't know Him, that the reason we celebrate Jesus at this time is twofold. His words and His life. Look just for a minute at the words he spoke and what it says in Luke 4:14-44.

First, we celebrate Jesus because He spoke gracious words. Have you ever tried to reach out to somebody? I have in the last two days. I have sat down with guys who wouldn't take me seriously. Who wouldn't take me as another human being. Who tried to goof off. Who weren't prepared to think. Who would say all kinds of silly little irrelevant asides to get off the real subject matter. And I find it frustrating. I find it as sometimes maybe you do, difficult to keep showing grace in the midst of a situation that is grave, a world that is disintegrating. This society wants answers, but won't listen when you start coming with some answers from Jesus. Well Jesus tolerated all of that. He was no mere Jesus freak like we are. He was the king of glory. If ever there was a man that ought to have stood up and become frustrated with the people, it ought to have been Jesus. But he didn't Brothers and Sisters, I want to say to each and every one that we are going to leave this place with some thrills and some frustrations.

We are going to leave it with frustration because of the Press. If ten guys stood here with a black power fist up, they would have made front page news. But if we stand up here in our thousands and march in peace and love and talk about Jesus, they don't seem to think its news. That to me is frustrating. You can pick up a newspaper and read page after page of inconsequential garbage. But when you get on to something that has got to do with real revolution, they don't want to touch it. They bury it. I go home with a gut full of the dishonesty, of the media. But, Brothers and Sisters, we dare not, because we follow the son of God, and because he spoke words with grace; we dare not, we must not lose our patience, and lose the graciousness across our own message as we present it to the people of our land. We must go back with peace, back with love, and we must go on and on and walk in the steps of the one of whom it was said, 'He is a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief, and the people hid as it were, their faces from him.' Yet he was willing. They rhubarbed Him. But His love was equal to it.

Secondly I wish to celebrate him this morning, because he spoke with courage. Now, I am just not knocking the church in general, but let me say this, that in this little account we read, Jesus stood up and he said some heavy things to an establishment religious situation. And they got mad with him. He said to them, 'Listen, you are just the same as your fathers. There have been the little have risen up as the great prophet in your midst, the Son of God, but you won't listen. He said, 'You know, in the days when Namaan was beautifully healed of his leprosy through the power of God — in that day, there were many lepers, but few of them were healed. Not because they couldn't be healed, but Namaan was the guy with the humility to get down and face the facts. And I want to say, Brothers and Sisters, I love Jesus. I more than admire him, I worship him, because he spoke with courage. And it didn't matter who got the barb.

He spoke with courage because he was a man concerned about truth. Bros & Sis, irrespective of what some neat philosophers might say to us, we dare not accommodate anything but truth. We must stand by that and we must stand by this book. And we must challenge them to read it, because of those that do not accept its truth, 99 per cent of them have never read it. We had a brother here yesterday who was telling me it was all crapp. It was about all he could say. When we asked him if he had read the life of Jesus, read the New Testament, he hadn't read it.

Yet he was prepared to say 'It's crapp'. The world is still like that. It will not read, it will not be intellectually honest, it will not take seriously the data that Jesus has given us. It will not examine the Son of God to see if he is real or not. But we dare not change simply because we live in a existential era when people think any vibe that turns you on becomes truth. We must stand by the propositions God has given us, and work them out in a real world.

And thirdly we celebrate Jesus because he spoke with authority. They could not handle that. If there was one thing that disturbed the teachers and leaders of the day, it was that Jesus spoke, not like the scribes with their endless inter-interpretations, but with clarity, with persistence and authority. You know, Brothers and Sisters, if you open the book of Acts you will find 2 illiterate guys, Peter and John, were out there preaching after a lame man was healed in front of thousands of people in that city. The people had testified to the fact that that lame guy had been lame all his life and was leaping like you guys were before when we were singing, one in the spirit.' But the heavies wouldn't listen. They wouldn't believe it. In fact they were cunning. They said, 'We can't stir too much because the people know what's happened. Let's try to cool it and get to the guys that caused it. They came to Peter and John and said "Cool it boys. Just cool it a bit. We don't mind if you have your little Jesus
Festival. We don't mind if you sit on the University
lawns and play your rock music. But don't get up
there and tell us anything about truth. We don't want to hear it. Even although we say we are an open forum for it.' And in that situation, Peter and John were not intimidated. Bros & Sis, our world is on the brink, of despair if not disaster. We dare not be silent. We must speak and speak and speak again. With a courage and conviction we must speak of the man of authority who indwells us. He has given us authority and his name to speak about truth. And in that situation, Peter and John stood up and they said, who do we listen to? God or man? They still continued to preach. 5,000 of the plebs were wrapped in what they said and got beautifully converted, much to the distress of the heavies. The common people said this, 'We can see that Peter and John are unlearned and ignorant men. But they speak with authority. It says, when they saw the power and authority of the speaking of Peter and John and that they were unlearned and ignorant, they took knowledge of them that they had been with Jesus. Bros and Sis, you will find that Christians are people of conviction, and they stand out in ugly contrast to the apathy and indifference of Western Society. They are difficult to handle because they are different. They speak with authority — not their own authority, but the authority of Jesus.

Fourthly, He spoke with power. This leads to a final major point that is important. There are many men that can speak with counterfeit authority. There are many people today that speak with authority, but the kind of authority they express is not the kind of authority that changes lives. I want to say to students particularly today, that any philosophy that will not work in practice, any philosophy that does not change people's moral behaviour, any philosophy that does not make people easier to live with, any philosophy that does not make people compassionate and involved is not worth the paper it's written on. And I want to say I am a Christian because Christianity is practical.

My final point is this. We celebrate Jesus, Bros. & Sis, not only because of his words, only but because of his deeds. Because of the deeds he manifested upon a cross, where they crucified him — yet he loved them. I have been thinking about the National Uni lawns, and the time I was attacked by some of our radical Bros & Sis. It was after I stood up in front of the microphone and said, 'Bros & Sis, in the name of Jesus we love you as students.' They could not handle it. They could not handle Jesus. It is like Tom Skinner puts it. Maybe it's over dramatic and maybe some of you exegetes will pull me to bits on it, but I think it's beautiful. He describes Barabas, an underground merchant, a guy who if he lived today, would have been throwing Molotov cocktails, and insurrectionist, a political hate monger, and they have Barabos. They have got Jesus, and they say, 'no worries'. We can deal with this guy who drops molotov cocktails. He is working on the level of the establishment. We can fight him on his own terms. We will just drop some napalin instead. And so they say, let's release him.

We can handle a man that fights like that. We can all deal with a man like that. But what do you do with a man who loves you when you hate him? What do you do with a man who comes up to a blind man and says 'See,' and the guy gets up and sees? What do you do to a man that comes to a dead man who stinks and says, 'Lazarus get out of your grave boy? and he comes alive? They could not handle Jesus. The only way to deal with him was to crucify him because he revealed the ugliness of their own hate, and the plastic nature of the whole system. That is why some of our Bros & Sis react so violently when we speak of His love.

Luke 4 says that he healed their emotions. The spirit of the lord is upon me to heal the broken hearted It says that he released the personality of people who were in bondage. Bros & Sis, where do you find free people? There are few free people around today. There was freedom across most personalities today—the annointing of God is upon Jesus his son to release captives, to give emotional liberty and freedom, to allow a man to know release from the bondage of his own self-centred ego. He enlightens our understanding because he gave sight to the blind. Those that search in vain to find a practical answer to the world's dilemnas, when they find Jesus, begin to see the real problem of man. He enlightens the eyes of the understanding. Is it any wonder that all their eyes were fixed on him, Bros & Sis? If we could get this crowd to file past this microphone for those that don't know Jesus, we would have Bros & Sis here who a few years ago were hooked on heroin, who had been through Govt programs, who had tried all sorts of bandaid therapy, who tried all sorts of surface answers, who sat in group therapy clinics, who have taken remedial drugs and it all was a bummer. But now they are released from the captivity of drugs through the sheer power of the indwelling Christ. And I want to challenge the Govt to have a look at the record of the Jesus movt. in terms of healed addicts. I believe statistically, we could back up the fact that Christianity works in this field. We have got Bros & Sis here amongst us who could only find release by being boozed out of their brains on the weekends and who could only find joy in hitting someone else with a bike chain. Today they can sit down with tears running down their face in compassion for their own generation in the bike world. One of our Brothers sat in our loungeroom one day with tears pouring down his face. He said, John, there was a day that I hated everybody. I hated even the guys in the bike club. I hated my parents. I hated the whole thing. But he said, since Christ invaded my life I just long to tell my Brothers and Sisters in the bike world that there is something better than hate, that they can be changed from within. They don't have to grunt their way through some religious culture pattern imposed from the outside - but be liberated from within so that they want to praise, want to rejoice, want to love, want to be involved with people on a compassionate level. 



Dear Judy,

Wow! Am I glad to hear from you! It's just really neat to know there are brothers and sisters around everywhere. "All over the world the Spirit is moving ..." as one of our songs go.

Things could be going better here in Seattle and the U.S. in general. Last year the Jesus People were swarming all over the place (in Seattle). Then a group calling themselves the Children of God moved in, and began taking over. They insisted that complete detachment from the world (literally: i.e. don't work, someone's bound to give you what you need) and the necessity to "go witnessing" (which means standing on corners telling everyone the gospel) were the only ways to get to God. Not only that, but they held that they had the only true interpretation of Bible passages.

One of the prominent Jesus People leaders, Linda Meissner, decided that the Children of God had it all together because she liked discipline and the Children sure had it. So she joined them. There were a lot of hassels involved in switching over and the newspapers and television picked up on the small religious war going on between the two groups. A lot of us have been wondering how good it was for so many people (the Jesus People) to depend on one human being to stay together. Now we found out, because the group, as such, began falling apart and

now is virtually extinct.

Meanwhile, the Children were out telling everyone that feared God to get out of the U.S., go to Canada or Europe, because the Bible predicted its doom and it was soon to be destroyed. They took over the Truth printing and completely changed it. It now reminds me of some doper's mag only with a bit of Jesus in it. They say they must attract attention, but I personally feel that compromise is not the way to win souls.

So now they're gone (almost) as well. The city seems comparatively quiet now. There are still lots of Christians and lovely people running around but they don't say "our group is right" like the other two did. (I except certain church groups from this

I really feel that something is going on, though. There are still many organized marches (like Easter and Christmas) and rallies and concerts, but they are not as appealing as they once were, probably because they are individuals putting on a show instead of a mass organisation.

But then God really does love us, and He's not gonna let ol' Satan get us if at

all possible. Well, I guess I better go. I really think it's wonderful that things are going well in your part of the world. The only thing I would request prayer for would be the U.S. in general. fads to come along. You can enjoy the fun for awhile but don't count on it as an eternal safety precaution. An emotional high will be satisfying only as long as you or a brother can sustain it. When the fad wears off and the t-shirts

wear out, then where are you? Proponents of pop Christianity with its watches and t-shirts are not flattering God when they hawk Jesus as just a panacea for a bad trip. They are not taking God seriously and dealing with sin, the reason Jesus Christ came to earth in the first place. God nowhere in Scripture asks for clever campaigns to get everyone on the block to give the One Way sign. In the Old Testament He says, "I am the Lord thy God and Him only shalt thou serve." Serving is a heavy duty and it falls in line with the word discipleship. In Matt. 28:19 Jesus said, "Go and make disciples..."

Those disciples are the disciplined followers He's looking for today, not the faddists who see a good thing and jump on.

A commitment to Jesus Christ involves not only having Him to rap with about problems, but first sensing a deep-set sin problem that you can do nothing about. Confess those sins to God the Forgiving Father through Jesus our Mediator (ITim.

When "movement" leaders gloss over the fact that sin must be confessed and forgiven, they mislead you and ignore the Scriptures. If they suggest that there is little else to following Jesus than receiving forgiveness, they do you grave injustice. After confessing sins, and forgiveness is given by the Father, the heaviest part is yet to come. "If anyone wishes to be a follower of mine, he must leave self behind; day after day he must take up his cross and come with me" (Luke 9:23). That cross and come with me" (Luke 9:23). That requirement of picking up a cross refers to anyone who would follow. Discipleship is no easy trip. It is a life or death venture with willing obedience to Christ as a requisite. The lukewarm "believer", or fad follower, or poster worshipper, will get the same judgment given the Laodiceans in Rev. 3:16: "... because you are lukewarm, neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth.

The true follower of Jesus also knows that Brother Jesus is not the only message to bring to the waiting world. He is our access to the Father (Eph. 3:12). The Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity, is receiving almost as much publicity as Jesus these days, but the Father, God the Creator, the Judge, is left without mention. Is this because God is too heavy to deal with in our culture? Is Jesus Christ Superstar more easily made palatable

to the public? The genuine believer in the genuine Christ will soon find that real tests of faith will come. God allows these trials to come into a life to bring strength. If Jesus' teachers do not preach about the chastening

love of God, if they only bring words from Brother Jesus who is all loving kindness with no words of rebuke, they tread on dangerous ground. Hebrews 12:6 says, "For the Lord disciplines those whom he loves, he lays the rod on every son whom he acknowledges." Fad Christianity does not preach chastening because it takes the golden "glow" off the beautiful picture of peace. Its teachers forget that it beautiful picture of peace. Its teachers forget that it is the truly wise and loving father who disciplines his

If you are an observer of these things, or you personally aspire to be one of His, do not let it be said of you, "they have bartered away the true God for a false one" (Rom. 1:25) because you worship the creation rather than the creator. The "things" themselves may not be bad. The posters of a handsome Jesus on a dorm wall, the bumper stickers saying "Honk if you love Jesus," the extended index finger pointing to heaven may be "in" but they are no guarantee of heaven and a "well-done thou good and faithful servant" when this day of fads is over. Wearing a Jesus watch with the arms of a ghost pointing to the time seems to be \$14.95 worth of pointing to the time seems to be \$14.95 worth of materialism if the life of the wearer does not point to Jesus. And if the life does, who needs the watch? Paul's letter to the Ephesians enjoins them to be "no longer children" (Eph. 4:14). They were to be made new in mind and spirit (Eph. 4:24). If this is to be true of the new believers finding their way into the free press the secular magaziner and the TV free press, the secular magazines and the TV specials, let them make certain they are following Jesus of Nazareth, God Incarnate, and not Jesus Christ Superstar who has no life-giving resurrection

power. Being part of a "movement" will never take the place of true fellowship with God the Son, through His Spirit. A "movement" can never satisfy its members' spiritual hunger if they are there because it's "in" to be "into Jesus, our soul brother, the anti-establishment hero." Leaders fail and personalities become sickening or stale without the life-giving Spirit of Jesus. Don't be fooled by a very pleasant Jesus who demands little of his followers. Follow Him to death, to the cross and beyond, or don't

A cheap Christ is no God, and no one less than God Himself is worth following.
